SCHOOL: Founded in 2013, John Paul II Catholic School is a coeducational school serving grades 6 to 12 in the Diocese of Charleston. Located in the Lowcountry between Hilton Head and Beaufort, South Carolina, John Paul II draws students from Hilton Head, Bluffton, Ridgeland, Hardeeville, Beaufort and other towns.

MISSION: John Paul II Catholic School educates students of all faiths in a caring, Christ-centered environment. We prepare students to be scholars with a soul in accordance with the traditions of the Catholic faith and through the intentional commitment to our core values of service, high expectations, innovation, excellence, leadership, and discipleship.

**CURRICULUM:** John Paul II Catholic School's curriculum is a demanding and diverse academic program providing learning opportunities for students of all abilities in accordance with our Catholic mission.

College Prep, Honors, Pre-AP, and Advanced Placement (AP) courses represent rigorous and quality coursework to prepare students for postsecondary education. Students are placed based on academic performance and teacher recommendations; for Advanced Placement classes department evaluation, test scores, faculty recommendation, GPA, and student interest are considered.

Academic skills and creativity meet in Project Lead The Way's pathways in computer science, engineering, and biomedical science which engage students in hands-on activities, projects, and problems focused on the development of students' ability to problem solve, think critically and creatively, communicate, and collaborate.

PRE-AP PROGRAM: Pre-AP courses deliver grade-level appropriate instruction through focused course frameworks, instructional resources, learning checkpoints, and collaborative educator workshops. JPII offers Pre-AP courses in English, Math, Science, History, and the Visual Arts.

AP CAPSTONE: This college-level program is based on two courses—AP Seminar and AP Research—that complement and enhance discipline-specific AP courses. Students who earn a score a of 3 or higher in AP Seminar and AP Research and on four additional AP Exams of their choosing are eligible to earn the AP Capstone Diploma.
