Congratulations to Mrs. Williamson

The Archdiocese of Mobile Office of Catholic Schools has announced that Andrea Williamson has been named the next principal of St. Michael Catholic High School in Fairhope, AL. She will finish the year at JPII and will assume the role for the 2023-24 school year. Mrs. Williamson has served as a teacher and Assistant Principal for Student Life since 2015.

"I have been blessed with the vocation of teaching in Catholic schools and I am honored to be chosen to take on the role of principal at St. Michael Catholic High School," Mrs. Williamson said. "Saint John Paul II told the young people of America to 'listen to His voice. Do not be afraid. Open up your hearts to Christ.' I remember hearing these words, from then-Pope John Paul II, as a young student in Catholic school challenging me to listen to His voice and this challenge has stayed with me ever since.

During her time at JPII, Mrs. Williamson was not only an excellent teacher, but the selfproclaimed "party planner" as well. Many of JPII's current events and traditions originated under her leadership. By training she was a social studies teacher, however her greatest academic contribution came in the establishment of the AP Capstone Diploma program. She also helped to revamp the senior project and was our very first teacher of the senior capstone course. Many of our graduates have been well prepared for college research by taking her classes.

We congratulate Mrs. Williamson on this accomplishment and wish her, Anna and John well as they transition to their new home. We expect that St. Michael Catholic High School will soon begin to look and feel a little like JPII South.

Thank You Coach Myers

We also learned this week that head football coach Mr. Chris Myers has decided to move on to likely pursue other opportunities closer to home. Coach Myers, the dad of a young and growing family, commuted over an hour each way to get to JPII. One can only imagine what time he arrived home following a Friday night football game.

Coach Myers arrived at JPII the year I arrived. While I was not involved in his selection, I quickly realized why he was the right man to lead a young and developing program. The team had

barely 20 players, when healthy, some playing football for the first time. They did not win a game; however I was impressed by Coach Myers' calmness and demeanor on the sideline. He never yelled like some football coaches are known to do, rather choosing to teach and encourage with positive words to his players. I knew right then and there he was the right man to build a winning program the right way. This past year, the JPII football program fielded its biggest and best team ever. Playing for the first time in the competitive Class 3A against larger schools, the Golden Warriors were ahead in 9 of their 11 games. They scored more points than any football team in JPII history. With many returning athletes, as well as a talented rising 9th grade class, the future could not be brighter for this program.

The search to replace coach Myers will begin this month as we hire teachers for the 2023-24 school year. While hiring a football coach the quality of Coach Myers is important, even more important will be hiring a highly qualified teacher and mentor first, who also happens to be an excellent football coach. One of the challenges I inherited at JPII when I arrived four years ago is that many of our coaches came from outside the school. While not unusual for such a small school with a big athletic program, I set a goal of hiring excellent teachers and high quality people who could also coach. The reason for this is that our teachers are also role models and mentors. Having them on campus both day and night only strengthens the quality of their relationship with students. It not only makes them a more effective teacher in the classroom, but a more effective coach as well. The results speak for themselves. In the past four years we have added Mrs. Louise Sanders (volleyball and soccer), Mrs. Jamie Roberts (cross country and track), Mr. Asa Haskins (football), Mr. Stephen Gaylets (football and baseball), Ms. Bri Sapienza (volleyball and softball), Deacon Brent Heathcott (basketball and softball), Mrs. Tracy Sklarin (tennis and cheer), Mr. Alan Lewis (basketball), Mrs. Karen Floyd (basketball), Mr. Brackin Lambert (baseball), Mrs. Anissa Sauls (cheer), and Mr. Richard Jennings (baseball). Add to them those staff members who were already here, Mrs. Kefrin Woodham (cheer), Ms. Haley Pina (soccer), and Mr. Brian Quinty (soccer), and we now have a coaching staff where the majority of head coaches are JPII teachers or support staff. I cannot emphasize enough what a difference maker that is.

The football program is in great shape for the next coach to build upon the foundation established by Coach Myers. Next year, it is quite likely over 60 boys will be in the program across grades 6-12. JPII will be the largest private school with grades 6-12 in the Lowcountry. An on-campus stadium, planned for the future, will bring new energy to the program. The addition of lacrosse will attract more athletes to the school. We offer a stipend competitive with the largest schools in SCISA. It will not be long before JPII will be known for its championship athletic programs, but more importantly, we will have built those programs the right way. Thank you Coach Myers for showing us how that is done.
